If you do not wish to record and submit a video, do not fill out the form. Introduce yourselves on the discussion board instead!


You will be recording yourself saying hello to the instructors and fellow classmates and telling us a little about yourself. The video should be quick, but should tell us:

- 3. Your favorite recipe -- this will give us ideas for interesting culinary topics to study!



UPLOADING TO YOUTUBE

For many of you this may be the first time that you upload videos to YouTube and you may not even have an account. The first disclaimer is: don't worry, you can make your video "unlisted," meaning that only the people that you give the link to will have access to the video (from their own privacy page: "Unlisted videos won't appear in any of YouTube's public spaces, like your channel page or search results"). Here's a step-by-step guide on the process to submitting your Hello Video.



Log on to Youtube.com When you first reach the page, click on the "Sign In" button on
the top right. Here you will have a choice to log in using your YouTube account (should you
already have one), your gmail account which is now linked up automatically with YouTube,
or you can create an account with your current email. Once logged in, click on the "Upload
button" on the top of the page.



2. Upload Your Video You should arrive at a page which allows you to find a video you have previously created (should you decide to do your video in another device and transfer it over to your computer) or capture video from your webcam where you can record yourself and immediately upload it. Please note the following restrictions on the videos you may upload:

- 3. Select Your Privacy Settings There's nothing wrong with setting your video to public if you choose to do so, but to those who prefer to remain "off the grid" (or as close to off as you can get while still participating) you may choose "unlisted." Do not select "private" as your video will then only be viewed by those that have permission via email.
- **4. Edit and Publish** YouTube has some tools to manage an edit your video should you need it. Add a title and a quick description and then just publish and copy the link into the form.

When you fill out the form, PLEASE be sure that your video url is in the format below, but be sure to change the last 11 characters to match the url of your own video:
