







Definition

- Mediation
 - supported by the Internet (whole process vs. parts of the process) = different types of e-mediation
- Cloud-based environment for disputants to come together for mediation





Definition

- Online Dispute Resolution (ODR)
- synonyms: e-ADR, i-ADR, cyber-ADR, ADR online
- E-Bay (<u>www.squaretrade.com</u>): commerce disputes between sellers and buyers
- Millions of dollars building out the functionality of a platform to resolve online disputes

Disadvantages

- Less personal
- Depending on the communication channel(s) used, no non-verbal information
- More distant
- More prone to conflict escalation
