

# Grading Policy

## Passing

This course is graded as pass/fail, meaning you will either be given a passing score or a failing score. **The score required to pass this course is 70%.**

## You will be graded on...

### Week exercises

At the end of each week, you will find a small handful of questions, named after "Exercises - Week  $x$ " (where  $x$  is the week number). These are designed to assess your progress in the course, week after week. Questions will be in the form of multiple choice, checkboxes, etc. *Week exercises will count towards 75% of the grade.*

### Final exam

The final exam will become available at the release of Week 6 on 7 July 2015. The final exam will consist of questions (multiple choice, checkboxes, etc.) covering the entirety of the course. *The final exam will count towards 25% of the grade.*

## You will not be graded on...

- In the "About the Web and W3C" section, there are 2 simple quizzes. They will not count in the final grade.
- You will find one question at the end of some pages. These questions are called "knowledge check", and as the name indicates it, they are designed to test your retention of the knowledge, page after page.
- At the end of Week 4, you will be asked to create a Web "monster", using HTML5 drawing and animation techniques that will be taught in Weeks 3 and 4. This is an optional exercise, meaning that it will not be graded.
