... Roshan's wife shields their son's eyes from the violence, she looks on in horror as Roshan is beaten.

GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL: "We warned you! We told you to stop!"

Roshan is kicked, beaten and stamped on by the officials' boots.



GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL: "Next time it's the end, you and your family!"

Shortly after, Roshan is standing with his wife and son.



ROSHAN: "Maybe... I should go, leave the country, leave this oppressive regime. I could go first, you could join me when I'm settled."
